NEW HOMES WITH HERITAGE

ROX is the reincarnation of the Brighton Astoria Cinema, once itself a grand Art Deco Brighton landmark.

On Thursday 21st December 1933, the 'Super Cinema' opened its doors to an eagerly awaiting public. The Mayor of Brighton was among the guests who attended the special programme launched to celebrate this momentous occasion.

ROX was one in a collection of six Astoria cinemas to be designed by architect Mr Edward Albert Stone and the only one situated outside London – the others being in Brixton (now Brixton Academy), Streatham, Finsbury Park, Charing Cross Road and Old Kent Road.

The Brighton Astoria was capable of seating 1,823 people and featured full stage facilities and an Art Deco auditorium decorated by renowned interior designers Henri & Laverdet. It also housed a tea room and restaurant – a place for patrons to rendevous and socialise.

Described as having a 'magnificent and imposing elevation', many parallels can be drawn between the site's past and present forms.

Patrons' comfort and convenience were key to the Astoria's experience planning process. This still holds true in the aims and ambitions of ROX creators, Ktesius Projects and Cove Burgess Architects.





The completion of the Brighton Astoria was described as an outstanding achievement worthy of this most beautiful of towns – one of many parallels we can draw with ROX today.

Like its original incarnation, the ROX building is a shining example of innovation in its field. No other development in the Brighton new homes sector offers a comparable ensemble of bespoke private residents' amenities.

ROX features a wealth of inspired design elements that pay homage to the Art Deco roots of the original building. These include the residents' cinema, coffered ceilings with concealed lighting, delightful proportions, and details such as a replica of the original Astoria signage fitted to the garden wall.

There is a sense of continuity between the interiors at ROX and the Astoria. Modern design is present throughout the spaces, which are decorated in rich, warm tones and luxuriously finished and equipped. And just like its predecessor, ROX benefits from large windows with 'splendid views' looking over Gloucester Place and Valley Gardens.

The Astoria went on to be a successful Cinema for many years until the 7th May 1977, when it closed after the last showing of Barbra Streisand's 'A Star is Born'. It was a Bingo hall for the next 20 years before closing its doors for the last time in 1997, after which time it eventually became derelict. Demolition of the Astoria began in 2018 to make way for a new lease of life and to regenerate the area.





VIBRANT & DIVERSE

Brighton & Hove is a cosmopolitan city which exudes an irresistible buzz and vibrance. The arts are an intrinsic part of Brighton life and the renowned Theatre Royal, Brighton Dome, Duke Of York's Art House and Brighton Museum are a stroll away. The city regularly hosts exhibitions and festivals including the annual Brighton Festival, which is one of Europe's largest art events.

The relaxed bohemian atmosphere of the nearby North Laine offers a melting pot of thriving culture; mixing chic vintage boutiques, avant-garde artistry and colourful pubs around the orient style spectacle of the Brighton Pavilion. This unique location is renowned for its diverse mix of shops, stylish cafes and restaurants.

Rising elegantly seven storeys high, design-led developer Ktesius and Cove Burgess Architects promised ROX would pick up on the attitude and spirit of 1930s urbanity. Even the name ROX is a witty play on Brighton Rock, the colourful candy stick synonymous with this discerning Victorian seaside town.

Taking reference from Brighton's signature regency buildings, white-glazed saw-tooth-pattern vertical brick fins scale the facade. Floor-to-ceiling glazing, curved glass and balconies clad in metallic coffee coloured zinc composite unite, defining the front elevation.

Ornate metal grills - replicas of those discovered inside the old cinema - screen the first-floor apartments, offset by the lush new landscape of the Valley Gardens conservation area.











Entering via the statement entrance lobby, there is an immediate sense of arrival at ROX, with inspired interior design that pays homage to its Art Deco roots.

garden, landscaped for year-round interest.

The studio, one and two-bedroom apartments are situated in the Gloucester Place building to the East - many of which have balconies and look out over Valley Gardens.

The penthouses situated above, offer unrivalled views in all directions across the City, up to the South Downs and down to the sea. These apartments are named after prolific people either from the era or cinematography to honour the heritage of the site.

The two townhouses and the duplexes encase the development to the South and West. The duplex apartments enjoy their own entrance over the bridge via the residents' lounge and the townhouses benefit from their own entrances from the quiet, pedestrianised walkway, Blenheim Place.

TRANSPORT LINKS

Brighton offers excellent transport links to London, major airports and the rest of the UK through the integrated rail and bus routes, as well as the A23 and M23 motorways.

While the majority of the City can be reached on foot, many of Brighton's residents choose to cycle, providing a leisurely way to navigate this alluring City owing to the attractive scenes and sustainable ethos that has long been associated with the area.





BLUE FLAG PEBBLE BEACH

ROX is a stone's throw from Brighton's Blue Flag pebble beach – a destination in its own right.

Soaking up the sun in one of the iconic deckchairs on the beach isn't your only option. There's a hive of activity to experience along the 5.4 miles of beaches from Blackrock near Brighton Marina all the way to Fat Boy Slim's Big Beach Cafe near Hove Lagoon.

There's a host of water sports to enjoy, from kayaking to stand-up paddle boarding, volleyball and basketball. Sail or jet ski your way into the weekend from Brighton Marina or learn how to Wakeboard and Windsurf at the Lagoon in Hove.







Take a wander or cycle ride along the promenade past Kemptown's signature Regency rendered townhouses. Along from the iconic Palace Pier, you'll find the beautiful Victorian Bandstand and the British Airways i360 – at 162m high, it's the world's tallest moving observation tower.

Some of the best restaurants, cafes and bars can be found nestled in the Victorian arches, which accommodate an exciting mix of independent eateries, cafes and bars offering everything from ice cream to high-end seafood.







VALLEY GARDENS - On Your Doorstep

PAVILION GARDENS - 7 min walk from ROX

Weave through the lawns and shrub beds of Brighton's Grade II Listed Royal Pavilion Gardens in all its Regency splendour. Intended to imitate forest scenes, the winding paths create a natural environment to kick back, relax and soak up the surrounding magical architecture designed by John Nash, an 1820's architect.

Recently restored to reflect Regency horticultural principles and to realise King George IV's vision, the gardens offer an oasis of calm among the cosmopolitan vibes of the city on your periphery.

QUEENS PARK – 14 min walk from ROX

Queens Park is cocooned in a sheltered valley between the two colourful neighbourhoods of Hanover and Kemptown. Here you can picnic in the park, play in the playground, feed the ducks on the pond or score a few on the tennis court of the Queens Park Tennis Club, overlooked by the redbrick Victorian clock tower.

With a strong community spirit surrounded by architecture of red brick, terracotta, stained glass and ornate rendered terraces, Queens Park is a wonderful and tranquil part of the city to be near to.
